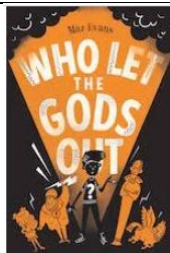

In English, students will explore a variety of exciting topics, including descriptive writing based on weather, explanation texts about the process of digestion, and engaging stories from Greek myths. In Guided Reading, we be reading 'Who Let the Gods Out' By Maz Evans. The class will participate in discussions and complete tasks using the VIPERS method (Vocabulary, Inference, Prediction, Explanation, Retrieval, and Sequence/Summarise). In Spelling, out weekly lessons will focus on prefixes and suffixes.			In the autumn term, Year 4 children will focus on building a strong understanding of place value, including reading, writing, comparing, and rounding numbers up to 10,000. They will also develop their skills in addition and subtraction, learning to use efficient written methods and solve problems with increasing confidence and accuracy. Homework with focus on fluency with number facts and times tables.	
Science	History		Art & Design	
Digestion- children learn about the digestive system as part of the "Animals, including humans". The lessons are often taught using hands-on models and experiments to show the journey of food through the body.	Children will explore the fascinating world of Ancient Greece. Children will learn where and when the Ancient Greek civilisation existed, investigate the differences between city-states like Athens and Sparta, and discover what myths and stories reveal about Greek beliefs and daily life.		Children will learn how structures can be designed to protect people, exploring the purpose and features of different types of helmets. They will investigate materials and construction techniques before designing and making their own protective helmet.

Children will explore the question "Are all religions equal?" by looking at beliefs and practices from faiths such as Sikhism and the Bahá'í faith.	Children will explore how to design and code interactive projects using Scratch. They'll deepen their understanding of scripts, decomposition, and variables, creating programs that include asking-and-answering (quiz) elements and dynamic scoring.		My healthy self: How can I make healthy choices? Children will learn how to make healthy choices that support their physical and mental wellbeing. They will explore topics including healthy lifestyles, personal hygiene, sleep, nutrition and how to make informed decisions about their own health.

Violin- Children will learn to play the violin. As well as learning notation, focus on rhythm and pitch and to read music.	Children will explore the question "How do I present myself in French?" by looking at personal details such as name, age, nationality, where they live, and using appropriate verbs and numbers up to about 70.		Children will develop their ball skills, including throwing, catching, passing and controlling a ball with increasing accuracy and confidence. They will also take part in a range of team games, learning how to work together, follow rules and use tactics to achieve a shared goal.
