English	Books	Mathematics
<p>We will be using our class book 'The Land of Roar' as inspiration for an adventure story. We will continue to use fronted adverbials, expanded noun phrases and a range of sentences to make our writing engaging for the reader. We will look at how speech can be used in our writing and how to use speech in the first and second in a sentence.</p>		<p>In Maths this term, children will learn to recognise and work with decimals, including tenths and hundredths, and will compare, order and round decimal numbers. They will also apply this understanding to real-life contexts by calculating with money in pounds and pence and reading, converting and solving problems involving time.</p>
Science	History	Art
<p>Children will learn how to identify and classify living things by observing their characteristics and using classification keys to group plants and animals. They will also explore how environments change, including the effects of seasons, extreme weather and human activities, and consider ways to protect plants, animals and habitats.</p>	<p>Children will learn about the Roman invasion of Britain, including why Emperor Claudius ordered the invasion and how the Romans used trained soldiers and military tactics to conquer parts of Britain. They will also explore the impact of Roman rule, including events such as Boudica's rebellion and how Roman settlements, buildings, towns and religion changed life in Britain</p>	<p>Children will learn how different materials can be shaped, joined and manipulated to create 3D sculptures. They will explore techniques such as carving, bending wire and combining recycled materials, while being inspired by artists to design and create their own sculptures.</p>

<p>Children will learn about the history and development of the Christian Bible, including how it was written, compiled and changed over time. They will also explore how the Bible is used and interpreted by different Christians and why it remains important to many people today.</p>	<p>Children will take part in outdoor learning this term, where they will explore the plants and animals in our local environment and learn how living things grow and survive in different habitats. They will also help to develop and care for our class vegetable patch, planting, observing and maintaining crops as they grow</p> <p>The class will learn about and play cricket and rounders this term.</p>	<p>Children will learn about rights, rules and responsibilities and how they can play an active role in their local community. They will also explore topics such as human rights, caring for the environment and respecting different opinions.</p>
