

English	Books	Mathematics
<p>This half term, the children will be exploring the story <i>Beegu</i> to support their learning in English. Through this engaging and imaginative text, the children will develop their understanding of characters and feelings, using this to help them write their own persuasive letters. They will learn how to share their ideas, give reasons for their opinions, and begin to use simple persuasive language to convince others.</p> <p>Alongside this, the children will also be learning about non-fiction texts, focusing on information about the continents and oceans of the world. They will explore how information texts are structured, learning to use headings, labels, and facts. This will help them develop their reading skills and begin to write their own simple information pieces.</p> <p>Throughout the unit, there will be a strong focus on building vocabulary, forming sentences correctly, and developing confidence in both speaking and writing.</p>		<p>This half term, the children will be developing their understanding of multiplication and division. They will explore making equal groups, sharing objects, and using practical resources to help them understand how numbers can be grouped and split.</p> <p>The children will also be learning about fractions. They will begin to recognise and find halves and quarters of shapes and small quantities, using everyday objects and visual representations to help them understand these concepts.</p> <p>The children will explore position and direction. They will learn to describe movement and turns, including left, right, forwards, and backwards, as well as using simple language to describe position.</p>
Science	Geography	Art
<p>The children will be learning about the seasons, with a focus on spring and summer. They will explore the changes that happen in the weather and environment during these seasons, such as longer days, warmer temperatures, and the growth of plants and flowers.</p> <p>The children will observe and discuss how trees, plants, and animals change, and they will begin to understand how these changes affect the world around them. They will also have opportunities to make simple observations, record what they notice, and talk about their ideas.</p>	<p>In this unit, the children will explore the theme of “local to global.” They will begin by learning about their local area before expanding their understanding to look at the wider world. This helps them develop a sense of place and understand how they fit into the world around them.</p> <p>The children will also learn about natural wonders, such as mountains, oceans, and forests, and human wonders, such as famous buildings and landmarks. They will explore what makes these places special and begin to compare different environments from around the world.</p>	<p>In this unit, the children will explore painting and mixed media through the theme of “Colour Splash.” They will experiment with paint techniques to create bright and expressive artwork.</p> <p>The children will learn about primary and secondary colours, exploring how colours can be mixed to create new shades. They will have opportunities to investigate colour through painting and printing.</p>

Religious Education	Computing	PSHE
<p>In this unit, the children will explore the question “How do we know that new babies are special?” They will think about why babies are important to families and how people show love and care for them.</p> <p>The children will learn about how different religions and cultures welcome new babies, including special celebrations and traditions. They will begin to understand that these events are meaningful and help families show that a new baby is valued and loved.</p> <p>Throughout the learning, there is a focus on sharing ideas, listening to others, and developing respect for different beliefs and ways of life.</p>	<p>In this unit, the children will learn about online safety and how to use technology in a safe and responsible way. They will begin to understand what the internet is and how it can be used for learning and communication.</p> <p>The children will learn how to keep personal information private and recognise that not everything online is always true or safe. They will be taught simple rules, such as asking a trusted adult for help if something makes them feel unsure or uncomfortable.</p>	<p>In this unit, the children will explore economic wellbeing and begin to understand the value of money. They will learn about where money comes from and how it can be used for different purposes, such as spending and saving.</p> <p>The children will also discuss making choices about money, recognising that we cannot always have everything we want. They will begin to understand the difference between needs and wants and why it is important to make sensible decisions.</p>

Weekly spellings</p>	<p>In PE, the children will take part in team games, developing their ability to work together and follow simple rules. They will practise key skills such as running, throwing, catching, and coordination through a range of fun and active games.</p> <p>The children will be introduced to games such as rounders and football, where they will learn basic techniques and begin to understand simple tactics. They will also develop skills in teamwork, communication, and taking turns.</p>
