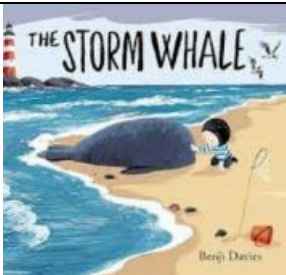

Pupils use their visit to Waddesdon Manor as inspiration for writing a recount, developing their ability to sequence events, use time connectives, and write about personal experiences. They also explore a range of stories, identifying key features such as characters, settings and plot. Pupils build their creative writing skills by planning and writing their own stories, focusing on sentence structure, vocabulary and basic punctuation.			Pupils develop their understanding of numbers to 100 by counting, comparing, ordering and representing numbers using a variety of concrete and pictorial resources. They learn to recognise and use coins and notes, solve simple money problems, and understand the value of different amounts. Pupils also explore time by telling the time to the hour and half past the hour, sequencing events, and using language related to time and duration.
Science	History		DT
Pupils identify and name a variety of everyday materials, including wood, plastic, metal, glass, rock and fabric. They explore the properties of different materials and investigate why particular materials are used for specific objects. Through practical activities, pupils develop observation, sorting and simple enquiry skills while learning about the world around them.	This unit introduces significant explorers and voyages from the past, exploring how journeys across seas helped people discover new places and expand knowledge of the world. Learning focuses on the achievements of key explorers, the challenges they faced, and how exploration has influenced travel, trade and our understanding of different countries and cultures.		This unit explores how structures are designed and built to be strong and stable. Children investigate different shapes, materials and joining techniques before designing and making their own pencil pot. Through practical activities, they develop skills in measuring, cutting, assembling and evaluating their finished product.

This unit explores the importance of kindness, respect and caring for others within different religions and worldviews. Learning focuses on how beliefs and values encourage people to help those in need, show compassion and build positive	This unit encourages children to explore seasonal changes in the outdoor environment by identifying signs of summer.
