




# Curriculum Map

<p>In English, students will explore a variety of exciting topics, including descriptive writing based on weather, explanation texts about the process of digestion, and engaging stories from Greek myths.</p> <p>In Guided Reading, we be reading ‘Who Let the Gods Out’ By Maz Evans. The class will participate in discussions and complete tasks using the VIPERS method (Vocabulary, Inference, Prediction, Explanation, Retrieval, and Sequence/Summarise).</p> <p>In Spelling, out weekly lessons will focus on verb and adjective suffixes.</p>			<p>In the autumn term, Year 4 children will focus on building a strong understanding of place value, including reading, writing, comparing, and rounding numbers up to 10,000.</p> <p>They will also develop their skills in addition and subtraction, learning to use efficient written methods and solve problems with increasing confidence and accuracy.</p> <p>Homework with focus on fluency with number facts and times tables.</p>	
Science	History		Art & Design	
Digestion- children learn about the digestive system as part of the "Animals, including humans". The lessons are often taught using hands-on models and experiments to show the journey of food through the body.	Children will explore the fascinating world of Ancient Greece. Children will learn where and when the Ancient Greek civilisation existed, investigate the differences between city-states like Athens and Sparta, and discover what myths and stories reveal about Greek beliefs and daily life.		Children will dive into a creative D&T unit on building pavilions. They’ll explore existing pavilion structures to understand what makes frames stable and strong, then use that knowledge to design their own aesthetically pleasing pavilion models.	
Religious Education	Computing		PSHE	
Children will explore the question “Are all religions equal?” by looking at beliefs and practices from faiths such as Sikhism and the Bahá’í faith.	Children will explore how to design and code interactive projects using Scratch. They’ll deepen their understanding of scripts, decomposition, and variables, creating programs that include asking-and-answering (quiz) elements and dynamic scoring.		Children will explore the question “What makes a family and healthy relationships?” by looking at respect and manners, understanding friendships, recognising the impact of their behaviour on others, and appreciating diverse family structures.	
Music	French		PE	
Children are learning about Hans Zimmer and why he is a trailblazer.	Children will explore the question “How do I present myself in French?” by looking at personal details such as name, age, nationality, where they live, and using appropriate verbs and numbers up to about 70.		In PE, children will focus on Football and Team Games with an emphasis on using a range of attacking and defending skills. Within the games they will vary the tactics and adapt rules.
