The Hughenden Dragon – Whole School Creativity and Excitement

Children throughout the school, from our tiny tots in Foundation class to our budding writers in Year 6, put pen to paper and created some scary descriptions and plots as well as some dragon art to go with them. We love that they have embraced this local folklore with such vigour and we encourage other local residents to look the tale up and do the same!



Spotlight on SEND: Areas of Need

There are four broad areas of Special Educational Needs and Disabilities outlined in the SEND Code of Practice ([SEND code of practice: 0 to 25 years - GOV.UK](#)).

These are:

- **Communication and Interaction:** This area covers children with speech, language, and communication needs (SLCN), including difficulty understanding or using language, as well as those who are Autistic.
- **Cognition and Learning:** This applies to children who learn at a slower pace than their peers, including those with Specific Learning Difficulties (SpLD) like dyslexia or dyscalculia.
- **Social, Emotional and Mental Health (SEMH):** This covers children who may be withdrawn, isolated, or display challenging/disruptive behaviour, which may reflect underlying mental health difficulties like anxiety or depression. ADHD is included in this category.
- **Sensory and/or Physical Needs:** This includes children with conditions that hinder their ability to use standard educational facilities, such as visual impairments (VI), hearing impairments (HI), or multi-sensory impairments.

Children may have needs that span across several of these categories, which can change over time.

In the next Spotlight on SEND, the focus will be on our provision for SEMH and resources that may help at home.

Spotlight on EYFS

Hoppers Classroom

This term Hoppers have been wondering... where in the world is, The Arctic?

We have looked at information books and globes to see where it is and learnt all about the animals that live there.

As we said goodbye to Miss Jackson, we then decided to learn about Australia and where in



the world that is. We've noticed that the Arctic is at the top of the world and Australia is at the bottom, down under! We've had lots of fun learning about the animals in both parts of the world and how they are different, what they eat and how big they are! We've even made our own Penguins and Great White Sharks! Next, we are learning about, Africa!



Foundation Classroom

This term Foundation have been learning all about 'People who help us.' They have had a visit from a Vet to talk about caring for animals and even got to see a fire engine and learn all about how the fire service keeps us safe. Thames Valley Police visited this week to showcase all they do to keep people safe – the sirens could be heard for miles and miles!

Foundation have also participated the whole school write, The Hughenden Dragon. They created an amazing Dragon, decorating their own scales and piecing it together. They have produced some lovely writing, using some fantastic adjectives to describe the Dragon.



Dropping off children

We are extremely lucky to have use of our turning circle. Please be reminded not to block it at morning drop off, despite this being on various Dojo posts, this still remains an issue. **Parents are not allowed to park in the staff overflow carpark at any time** as this prevents staff from parking and delays their start to the day which in turn, affects children's learning.



All children arriving after the gates have closed, will need to be signed in at the school office on our Inventory system by the adult bringing them to school.

Parking Permits – these need to be reapplied for on a termly basis – please email the school office to request with a brief explanation as to why it is needed. All permits issued for the Summer Term are no longer valid.


