




# Curriculum Map

English	Books	Mathematics
<p>In English, children will explore poetry by reading, performing and writing simple poems, focusing on rhythm, rhyme and descriptive language. They will also write instructions on how to grow a plant, linking their learning to Science and practicing clear sequencing and bossy verbs. In addition, children will develop their narrative writing skills through work based on <i>The Wild</i>, using the story to inspire their own character descriptions, settings and simple story structures with a clear beginning, middle and end.</p>		<p>In Maths, children will develop their understanding of place value within 50 by counting, reading and writing numbers, exploring tens and ones, comparing numbers, and placing them on a number line. They will also learn to measure and compare length and height using language such as longer, shorter and taller, beginning to measure in centimetres. Children will explore mass and volume by comparing objects using vocabulary such as heavier, lighter, full and empty.</p>
Science	History	DT
<p>In Science, children will learn about plants by identifying and naming common wild and garden plants, including trees. They will explore the basic parts of a plant, such as roots, stem, leaves and flowers, and investigate what plants need to grow and stay healthy. Children will also observe changes over time, including how seeds and bulbs grow into plants.</p>	<p>In History, children will explore how traditional tales and legends help us learn about the past in Scotland, Wales and England. They will listen to and compare well-known legends linked to significant historical figures and events, discussing what these stories tell us about bravery, leadership and life in the past. Children will learn that legends are passed down through generations and may be inspired by real people and real events from history.</p>	<p>In Design and Technology, children will design, make and evaluate their own puppets. They will explore different materials and joining techniques, such as cutting, gluing and stapling, and consider how to make their puppets strong and suitable for purpose. Children will develop their creativity and practical skills while learning how to improve their designs.</p>
Religious Education	Outdoor learning	PSHE
<p>In RE, children will explore the question “Why should we care for others?” They will discuss kindness, respect and compassion, and learn how different religions and worldviews teach the importance of helping and caring for people in our communities. Children will reflect on how they can show care and consideration in their own daily lives</p>	<p>In Outdoor Learning, children will take part in hands-on activities with a focus on plants and planting. They will plant seeds, care for growing plants and observe changes over time, developing their understanding of what plants need to survive.</p>	<p>In PSHE, children will learn about Citizenship by exploring what it means to belong to a community and how they can be responsible members of it. They will discuss rules, fairness and respect, and understand why these are important at school and beyond.</p>
