

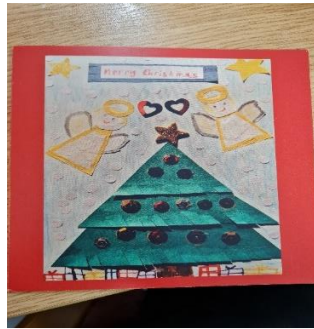

Dear Parents / Carers,

The end of term in a primary school is always a very special time and Autumn 2020 has been no different despite the challenges we are facing with the pandemic. Seeing the children's faces as they met Father Christmas this week and their eagerness to fill the post box with hundreds of Christmas cards makes the effort worthwhile as we try to ensure the children do not miss out on the excitement. Sadly, there were technical issues with the virtual pantomime that the PTA kindly arranged but I understand they will be sending it directly to our families so that you can watch it at home.

The only disappointment this term was that our KS1 pupils did not get to perform in front of their families. Thank you to one of our parents, Mr Cook for recording *Christmas Around the World* for us – this will hopefully be sent to parents of Y1 and Y2 shortly. The children did very well and sang their hearts out for you! Mr Cook also filmed the Foundation singing and this will also be shared with parents shortly.

Sadly, at the end of this week, we said goodbye to Jackie Churchman who is moving onto work full time with the Registration Service which has been a passion of hers over the years. She will be sorely missed by the Hughenden Team and we wish her all the very best.

We also said goodbye to Mrs Quartermaine who has taught Year 6 this half term as she is needed back at her usual school and thank her for stepping in at short notice.

We have a few parents who have a permit or disabled badge to park in the disabled bays outside the front of the school. These must be displayed in the front of your car. If you do not have one of these permits, you should not be parking in these bays – that includes dropping off at Hoppers. We believe there are only 2 families with a permit – if you need one, and have a valid reason for requesting one, please contact the office.

We are happy for the turning circle to be used to 'drop and go only' but children must not be let out of the car until you are at the front of the queue – we hope this will help to relieve pressure on the local road. You must stop, drop and go. This isn't a service where you can park up, walk your children into school and then go. Children need to be able to walk themselves through the gate so that you can drive straight off. Please do not wait for your children to go through the gate, once you have dropped them you can go. If you need to physically get out of the car to bring them to the gate, then you will need to park outside of the school.

A polite reminder that all **parents should wear masks** when coming onto the school site unless you have a specific medical reason.

We have put numbered signs up outside the front of school this week so that the children know where to wait in the morning until the gate is open. Some children are arriving very early, they should not be on site until 8.40am when a member of staff will be there to supervise them. We will open the gate between 8.40-8.45am, when there are a larger number of children waiting outside. You do not need to wait with your child once they have been dropped off through the gate.

All children need to be in school no later than 9am for registration so learning can start – children are still arriving after 9am which will be recorded as a late arrival. We have had a few parents arriving quite late recently to collect their children – please do your best to arrive on time and notify us of any late arrivals so we can update teachers and reassure children accordingly – thank you.

With regards to birthday sweets and chocolates, we can only accept these if they are individually wrapped into small bags and have been quarantined for 72 hours before distribution. They can be distributed at home time outside by the birthday child.

Should school need to close, or opening times need to change for inclement wintery weather, please check the School Closures List for updates. We will also inform all parents via email and text. Decisions will be made, taking all considerations into account including the safety of staff.

A reminder that Friday 18th December is a remote learning day. All children will be provided with activities for Friday. We are having a large number of requests to collect children early at the moment which is not acceptable unless it's for a medical appointment. It causes disruption to the adults who have to arrange for the children's early departure as well as meaning your child/ren miss their learning time.

If **after Thursday and until December 23rd**, if your child develops symptoms of coronavirus and then tests **positive**, you must let the school know on the emergency number I sent out last week. **07568 663110**. This is so that we can alert other families in your child's bubble. That number should only be used to report positive Covid results and only if your child tests positive. We do not need to know if a member of the family tests positive unless the pupils attending Hughenden Primary School also tests positive.

Please do drop me an email via the office if there is anything important I need to be aware of. In the meantime, I wish you and your families a peaceful, happy Christmas holiday and a Happy Hanukkah with your families.

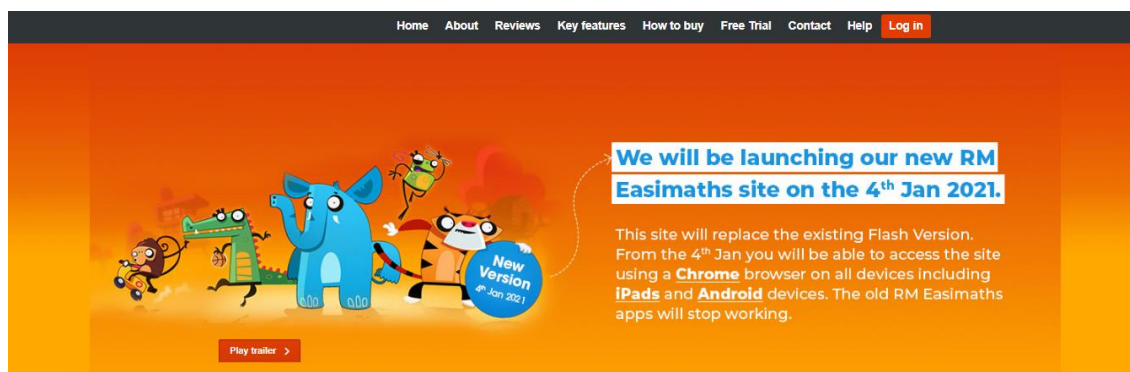

Music Update

We've had a brilliantly musical term, the children have all worked really hard to get involved in all of our activities, which have included Doctor Who, Bizet's Carmen, 'Mars' from Holst's 'The Planets', 'Welcome to the Orchestra', Adams's 'Short Ride in a Fast Machine', 'Heroes of Troy', 'How Sound is Made', Mussorgsky's 'A Night on a Bare Mountain' and Villa Lobos's 'The Little Train of Caipiri'.

For Christmas, we have recorded two short concerts (KS1 and KS2) which I hope you will enjoy watching - we all really enjoyed practising our singing and recording them! Details will be sent out to each year group before the end of term.

Next term is all about making music - Foundation and Year One will be experimenting with percussion, Year Two with glockenspiels, Year Three ukuleles, Year Four will be learning to play the recorder and Years Five and Six will be playing ukuleles and the African Drums. We are also hopeful that we will be able to start our choir again! We will have a lot to show you by Easter!

- Pupils will need a warm coat and to wear their school cardigan / jumper as the windows and doors remain open in school for additional ventilation and it is getting colder.
- PE kits can be replaced with the school PE kit when your child has outgrown their current kit.
- Please ensure your child has wellies in school so they can go on the school field at lunchtime.
