SCHOOL NEWS



Dear Parents / Carers,

It is hard to believe it is October already, the children continue to work really hard in their lessons, classrooms are well organised and displays are added to daily. Thank you to all the parents who attended our recent coffee mornings – we hope you found the information useful and informative, it was lovely to finally be able to welcome you all back into school. For those that were not able to attend the curriculum overviews are on the school website for you to view. The revised collection times (3.10 for KS1 and 3.20pm KS2) are working well although we recognise that it is still very busy at the gate at the end of the day.

I do need to remind you that only parents with a valid parking permit are allowed to park on the school site before or after school. We will be monitoring this carefully over the next few weeks so expect to be challenged if you are one of the consistent offenders. If you have older children who can walk to a meeting point, this will be really helpful and also supports their independence in preparation for secondary school. Please ensure you have signed the consent form for this to happen.

In terms of ongoing school processes, all staff have now completed their annual safeguarding training updates and this morning rehearsed our first lockdown procedure following on from our fire drill last week. This went very smoothly and the children reacted calmly and continued with their work as if nothing was happening!

As part of the schools continued development, our staff meetings this term are focused on further development of the curriculum and teaching and learning pedagogy. Mr Morey is leading on this development and so far, we have developed our understanding of working memory (the principle being that everyone has a different working memory capacity) and cognitive overload (principle being that pupils can only consciously attend to a handful of stimuli at any one time.) Using educational research to develop our practice is something we are committed to as we continue to develop the opportunities for your children to reach their potential.

This term we have purchased a new scheme of work for Computing, Art & Design, DT, French and PHSE /RSE which have been well received by the teachers and have enabled new ideas and resources to be shared with

the pupils which will ensure progression and consistency cross the school. Each 'topic' provides a *knowledge Organiser* and we will be sharing these with you via class DoJo at the start of each new topic so that you can see the key vocabulary and concepts your children are taught and are expected to remember (an example is below.)

Parking

Sadly, there are still a small minority of parents parking inconsiderately/dangerously within the local side roads of the school including Friars Gardens/South Maundin also. Phonics Parent Workshop – 5th October, 8.45am School Hall


Parents of Foundation, Year 1 and selected Year 2 who are new parents to the school, are welcome to join us for our Phonics Workshop in the school hall which is being run by Mrs Penfold and Mrs Wainwright. Information booklets have already been shared at the Coffee Mornings, these will also be emailed out and put on the school website.

Behaviour Rockets

As many of you have seen in the classes whilst you were at the parent's coffee mornings, we have a new, whole school system in place to encourage children to make positive choices and reap the rewards of doing so.

The rocket is a clear visual message which has been designed with input from staff and children. All children start afresh each new day on the green section, then for making smart choices, working hard etc., they can move up the rocket where they will be rewarded with Dojo points, praise, stickers for example. If, for any reason they do not make the right choice, they may find themselves 'losing power' and moving down the rocket onto yellow, orange and then red. There are far more stages than the last whole school behaviour strategy in place and they can move back up the rocket by making good decisions.

The children have responded well to it, and all are looking to reach the very top, to 'reach for the stars', where the Headteacher will be giving Headteacher awards, the children will share their work with the Senior Leadership Team and also the parents may well receive a postcard home.

We are delighted to share details of our Harvest Festival with you. We plan to walk the KS2 children to St Michaels & All Angels Church for a 2pm service. Parents are welcome to meet us at the church at 2pm if you wish to attend but please wait outside allow the pupils to be seated first. All KS2 pupils need to be collected from the church at 3pm.

Our Hoppers, EYFS and KS1 children will celebrate Harvest in school. We are asking for tinned goods donations towards the One Can Trust which can be brought into school during the course of that week. Here is a list of their current needs:

Tinned ham, Corned beef, Tinned mixed veg, Tinned tomatoes, Tinned fish, Tinned halal meat, Pasta, Rice (500g), Biscuits, Healthy cereals, UHT milk, Cooking sauces, Baked beans, Deodorants, Toilet roll, Nappies (sizes 4 - 7 only), Baby formula milk stages 1 and 2, Washing up liquid.

Good to Grow!

Parents Evening

Dates have been set for our Parents Evening appointments which we are planning to hold face to face. The dates are the 20th and 21st October. Parents can book their appointments using their eSchools login, if you need a password reset, please contact the school office. Bookings will go live on the 1st October 2021 and close on the 15th October 2021.

Covid update

As the government have now eased the restrictions, we have amended our internal procedures accordingly. It is now personal choice as to whether face masks and visors are worn by staff in school and when parents drop off and collect. However, we request that you maintain a 2m distance if talking to members of staff and that if you attend school events this term, you do continue to wear a face covering. The risk has certainly not gone away (and is increasing in Buckinghamshire again) so we need to continue to be vigilant.

If a member of your household tests positive, your child can continue to attend school according to government guidelines but we would prefer they take a Lateral Flow Test at home initially following by a PCR test if required to make sure they are not carrying the virus without any symptoms. You may of course, prefer to keep your child at home for a few days to make sure they do not become ill and we will also support parent's decision on this.

If increased positive cases are seen in school, we will inform parents of that class group and may need to close bubbles again if there are increased positive cases. Please do inform us as early as possible if there are any positive cases within your household.

Health Care Plans

There are currently some plans that remain outstanding for parental checking and approval. If we have sent a copy home for checking, please return it to the School Office so we know our records are current and we are able to meet the medical needs of your child.

<u>Uniform</u>

It's been lovely to see the children return looking so smart in their uniform, however, we have noticed a few children not wearing their full uniform, ties, etc. or arriving with their shirts not tucked in. Please also note, that PE kits must be white/navy/grey/black – no bright colours or slogan tops please. PE kit should now be brought into school and kept in school, NOT worn on PE days. A reminder that the only jewellery that should be worn are stud earrings and a wristwatch. Please also ensure that any hair bobbles, bows or scrunchies are discreet and not 'fashion items.' These can be worn on Mufti days but are not part of everyday school uniform.

Please also ensure your child has a rain coat in school each day. Several pupils have been caught out this week with the unexpected rain and it is not pleasant for them having to sit in wet clothes after break / lunchtime.

SchoolGrid accounts

Thank you for all our parents for supporting us in ordering your child's school lunch from home, it really does help us. Our preference is for all pupils in KS1 to order a school lunch as this is funded from the government but if for particular reasons you prefer to make a packed lunch, that is also fine on the understanding that there will not be any spare lunch if the lunchbox is forgotten!

<u>Please can parents in KS2 check their account balances and ensure there are funds available to cover all</u> <u>meals ordered and taken as we have been informed that some balances have been outstanding for a</u> <u>considerable length of time.</u>

Permission to Walk Home

Children in Upper KS2 (years 5/6), with permission from parents or carers, are able to walk home or to a meeting point – if you would like your child to do this and have not yet given consent to do so, please ask the school office for a form to complete or send an email to the school office. Please make sure your child knows the arrangements. This is for a long standing arrangement. For any last minute arrangements, please continue to notify us and supply a password if the person collecting is unknown to the staff.

Mobile Phones

Children in Year 5 and 6 are allowed to bring in their mobile phones and must hand them into the school office on arrival. Before sending your child into school with their phone, please request the permission slip from the school office. Thank you.

Flu vaccination Clinic in school – 2nd November 2021

Children in years Foundation to Year 6 will have the opportunity to have their Flu vaccination done in school by the School Nursing Team. Further information will be sent home in the coming week giving you the option to opt out if you wish. This will be an online opt-out form that goes directly to the School Nursing Team.
