#### **Building Shelters – by Hamza**

In school recently, year 6 made shelters in the Nature Reserve Area. I found that it was fun: we had no restrictions to our imagination but I also had a wonderful group of six friends of mine.

In order to start, my group and I received a bag full of resources: tarpaulin, ropes, and blue (washline) pegs. As soon as our design was decided, we set off to work. Everybody had their own jobs but we also helped each other. We were concerned about winning and hopefully receiving a reward.

After trial and error, my team and I found it a struggle to build the shelters: we all had to reach up high since the tarpaulin kept dipping down from the middle. Our design was to attach the tarpaulin to four slim trees with some rope. It would be able to stop us from getting wet, however it was not wind-proof.

After the hardship of putting everything together, Mrs Messenger - the year 6 teacher- had two litre bottles full of water and splashed it onto all of the tents. To my amazement, our tent stood tall and did

not fall. Even though the majority of the year 6 were wet, we all had extreme fun and went back to class.

#### Building Shelters – by Shyna

On Monday 7th March, we built shelters and it was really fun! We were split into groups of 5 and 6 and we worked together, as a team, to try and create a shelter which was protective of water if it started raining. As we were working together, I felt really happy and excited as we did manage to make the shelter with success; we did fail a few times but we tried again!

We had equipment such as: a waterproof protection so we didn't get wet; pegs to hold the shelter together; strings to attach the cover to something if essential; and lastly, a hammer to put the pegs in the ground. The most important part was that we worked as a team otherwise we wouldn't have succeeded in making the shelter!

Additionally, we created the shelters because we are learning about how to survive on a desert island. In order to survive on a desert island, the most vital step you must do is to create a shelter otherwise surviving on a desert island is most unlikely. As shelter is the most important tool in survival, we created shelters based on what we were learning about. I had lots of fun creating the shelters (I would do it again if there was an option)!



## Covid Guidance Update

I am sure you are aware of the Governments latest communication in relation to Covid rules - **moving from** "government restrictions" to "personal responsibility".

Whilst there is now no legal requirement to self-isolate after a positive Covid test, pupils and staff who test positive are still advised to remain at home for at least five full days and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received two negative test results on consecutive days.

## The removal of Covid rules in schools

Recent guidance published by the DfE reads: "If parents insist on their child attending nursery, school or college when they have symptoms, the school or nursery setting can take the decision to refuse your child if, in their reasonable judgement, it is necessary to protect other pupils and staff from possible infection with Covid 19."Any decision would need to be carefully considered in light of all the circumstances and current public health advice."

At Hughenden Primary School, we expect that the vast majority of our families will follow the updated guidance and keep their child off school if they test positive for Covid, informing the school office so that we can monitor cases and update other families where appropriate as we have been doing over recent months.

The UKHSA guidance is clear that, while there is no longer a legal requirement for people with Covid to selfisolate, if you have any of the main symptoms of Covid or a positive test result, **the public health advice is to stay at home and avoid contact with other people.**"

The DfE's operational guidance "appears clear that schools and colleges should have robust policies in place that anyone with Covid symptoms should be asked to stay at home and take a PCR test, and that **anyone with a positive test should be required to stay at home for 10 days or until they test negative for two consecutive days from day five, whichever is the sooner".** 

We appreciate your ongoing co-operation.
