Dear Parents,

This term, Year 6 will be learning about Human Reproduction and Relationships as part of the National Curriculum for Science. Below, I have outlined the different subject areas that your children will be taught.

## **Programme of study for Year 6:**

- · Children to look at the differences between plants and animals.
- · Children look at the differences between people living in Britain today.
- · Children will have the chance to discuss the meaning of a multicultural society.
- · Children will discuss the reasons for reproduction and set up the flower babies project for the week.
- · Learn the correct names for the sexual organs.
- · Children to learn about personal hygiene during puberty.
- · Children will look in detail at the life cycle of humans, gestation periods and life spans.
- · Children to consider the changes they have undergone since they were a baby.
- · Baby photo challenge.
- · Look at the proportions of human adult body compared to a human child's body.
- · Look at the physical changes that take place during puberty.
- Look at sex specific events that take place (taught separately) i.e wet dreams and menstruation and rites of passage in other cultures when children reach puberty.
- · Children will have opportunity to act out scenarios between parents and teenagers, discussing different viewpoints and compromises.
- · Children will have the opportunity to discuss the meaning of friendship and where help can be found.
- · Children will have the chance to discuss how names are chosen as well as the meaning and significance of both first names and family names.
- · Children will have the opportunity to discuss relationships found in society and marriage rites.
- · Children will have the opportunity to use drama to say no to peer pressure for smoking, alcohol or drugs.
- · Children to discuss body image and their feelings towards it.
- · Children will have the opportunities to discuss sexual health including STI and STD's.
- · Children will also briefly discuss the role of contraception in regards to sexual health.
- · Children will also learn about and discuss being safe online when making friends lead by Alison Watts from the CEOP team.
